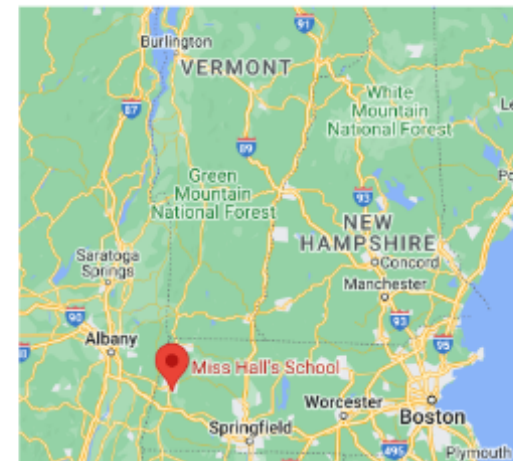
Dormitories and Student Life:
